Objectifs pédagogiques du cours :

To explore the familiar fields of political thought, political life and political institutions through the prism of gender studies. The aim is to ponder the extent to which politics is a uniquely gendered domain of human activity, and the consequences this has for how women and men take part in this major field of human activity.

Contenu / descriptif du cours :

This course is divided into three sections :

- Section one, Gender and Political Theory, seeks to show how deeply gendered the Western tradition of political thought is. (...)
- Section two, Gender in Political Life, looks at political parties, trade unions, social reform movements and elections. (...)
- Section three, Violence and Political Bodies, takes up the theme broached by Fanon in section two by exploring two ways in which political identities are shaped by political violence. (...)
