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SCIENCES PO AIX: A GRANDE ÉCOLE CONNECTED TO THE WORLD

Since 1956, the date it was founded, Sciences Po Aix, a public higher-education institution, has been delivering high-level 5-year diplomas and training to future executives in the private and public sectors. Sciences Po Aix, a member of the Conférence des Grandes Écoles, strives to develop high-quality multidisciplinary education based on humanities and social sciences.

The education provided is based on general knowledge, sociology, social sciences, political science, law, economics, international relations, history, foreign languages and methodology. This education, internationally oriented, develops the ability to synthesize and express views based on strong general knowledge and specialized knowledge.

Sciences Po Aix is, above all, a school open to the world. In an effort to constantly improve this openness, the school strengthens partnerships and increases exchanges with foreign universities. Every year, nearly 250 foreign students are welcomed in the different courses, for a semester or a year. The students at Sciences Po Aix, in their 3rd year, spend an academic and / or professional time abroad. This internationalisation induces numerous international partnerships, allowing student mobility and teaching, as well as international scientific programmes and receiving foreign researchers.

AT SCIENCES PO AIX FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

Programmes 3 types of courses are offered to international students:

Certificate of Political Studies (CEP)

A one-year university certificate, consisting of:

- → Two compulsory lectures (20-hour modules):
- Semester 1 « French political life » Semester 2 « France in the world »
- → Two methodology seminars (continuous assessment).
- \rightarrow Four lectures to choose from in the course catalogue, including at least two in French.

All courses represent a total of 60 ECTS credits (30 per semester). Level B2 in French is the minimum required to register for the CEP.

Annual Political Studies Programme (PEPA)

This programme is intended for students who wish to take courses in a more flexible way over one year. The PEPA consists of a combination of lectures (4 ECTS credits each) and seminars (5 ECTS credits) to choose from in the course catalogue for international students. The maximum number of credits is 34 per semester, according to the student's choice and with the agreement of their home university. This programme does not deliver a university certificate, however a transcript of records with grades and credits earned is issued to students and

sent to their home university.

The one-semester Political Studies Programme (SPSP)

This programme is intended for students who wish to take courses in a more flexible way over one semester. The PEPS consists of a combination of lectures (4 ECTS credits each) and seminars (5 ECTS credits) to choose from in the course catalogue for international students. The maximum number of credits is 34 per semester, according to the student's choice and with the agreement of their home university. This programme does not deliver a university certificate, however a transcript of records with grades and credits earned is issued to students and sent to their home university at the end of each academic period.

Caution: the choice of the programme must be made in agreement with the home university, which can require certain prerequisites.

Admissions International students must meet the requirements below:

Exchange students, from a partner university of Sciences Po Aix

(Erasmus +, bilateral agreements, specific international programmes, ISEP, or BCI):

- → Hold a diploma equivalent to the French Baccalaureate.
- \rightarrow Be enrolled at a foreign partner university.
- → Have completed three semesters of graduate studies. Exchange students are exempt from tuition fees at Sciences Po Aix.

Independent students or "Free movers":

- → Hold a diploma equivalent to the French Baccalaureate
- → Have completed two years of higher education in a foreign university Students who are not part of an exchange programme must pay the tuition fees at Sciences Po Aix.

Language requirements

Applicants must have a satisfactory level of language according to the chosen programme:

— CEP

Candidates for the programme must have a satisfactory knowledge of the French language, level B2 or equivalent: diploma or certificate issued by a French Alliance, a French Institute or another accredited body or a language certificate provided by a teacher of French from the home university.

— PEPA/PEPS

Send a satisfying language level certificate from a language teacher of the home university, Alliance Française, Institut Français, or any other authorised body. Depending on the student's level, some courses will not be accessible.

— Study in English
For non-English speaking students:
submit a language level certificate
or English test certificate
(TOEFL, IELTS). A student who has
taken at least fifty percent of their
courses in French either in "PEPS or
PEPA programme in French".

Nomination & application

Students applying for one of our programmes must be nominated by their university:

- \rightarrow at the latest on May 1^{st} if mobility is planned for the first semester or the year
- → at the latest on October 1st if mobility is planned for the second semester

Once nominated by their university, the candidate will receive an application to fill in and send with the required supporting documents. The student's application must be submitted:

- \rightarrow no later than May 15th if mobility is planned for the first semester or the year
- \rightarrow at the latest on October 15th if mobility is planned for the second semester

Once the application is received by Sciences Po Aix (completed and validated), the student will receive an official letter of acceptance.

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Registration

Students will be given their certificate of registration upon arrival with a login and an individual password allowing access to the Wi-Fi network of Sciences Po Aix as well as the various online educational platforms (schedule, ENT, Equinox, Hyperplanning). Students also receive a student card that will allow them to prove their enrolment in a French higher education institution and give them access to various promotional offers and deals.

Students outside Europe:

Courses

Lectures and seminars

Education at Sciences Po Aix is reflected in two complementary course formats, namely the lectures in an amphitheatre comprising all the students following a common course, and the seminars in small groups to deepen the bases of theoretical works studied in class as well as the language level of the student. Attendance at seminars is mandatory. Three absences, per semester in a seminar, will be reflected in the student's assessment.

Choice of courses:

International students benefit from the multidisciplinary courses of Sciences Po Aix: International Relations, Political Science, Economics, History, Law. Journalism and Communication. Sociology, Religion and Society, Foreign Languages, French, etc., and courses taught in English, Spanish, German and Arabic. It is recommended that international students choose courses from the list that is reserved for them: as well as courses for French students which are also accessible to them. Students may choose among the various courses in accordance with the conditions of their programme and always subject to the agreement of their home university.

Note: Registration for seminars will be confirmed with the academic coordinator at Sciences Po Aix, Mrs. Émilie Coulon, during the orientation period. The choice of these courses cannot be modified. The choice of lectures will be final at the time of the pedagogical enrolment, which will take place a fortnight after the beginning of the courses.

Schedule

The online schedule confirms the existence of a course, as well as provide information on the day, hour, room, etc. It is therefore essential to regularly check any changes at: planning.sciencespo-aix.fr (login using the username and password on the certificate that the students receive after completing their administrative registration).

Assessment

Attendance at exams is mandatory. If the student does not attend an exam for which he/she is registered or if he/she does not hand in requested work, the subject appears on his/her transcript with 0 credits. «Justified absence» is written on the report only for illness, serious family reasons, etc., and must be justified by an official document. «Unjustified absence» is written for any other absence.

To validate a subject and obtain the credits, the student must obtain the grade of 10/20. Any grade below 10 is eligible for the resit exam in June (or July for Semester 2).

A student with a unexcused absence for a final exam will not be able to resit the exam.

Each course is validated individually. Under certain conditions, «jury points» can be awarded.

«Jury points» validate a course without having to resit the exam.

— Lectures

With the exception of the three-hour written exam (CEP), exams take the form of either an oral exam (interview with the teacher), a one or two-hour written exam or assignment to be submitted.

The type of exam will be specified by the teacher.

— Seminars

Teachers explain to students how they will be assessed throughout the semester (continuous assessment).

At the end of each study period, an official transcript of records will be sent directly to the partner universities. Students can download their results on the University's Digital Workspace (ENT) accessible at: ent.univ-amu.fr

Grading system

ECTS credits

Sciences Po Aix recognises and applies the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). The validation procedures for the year of mobility are provided for in the study rules. A full-time academic semester represents a volume of 30 ECTS credits, and therefore 60 ECTS per year. Seminars are worth 5 ECTS (except "FLE niveau 1" which is worth 10 ECTS) and lectures 4 ECTS.

A study agreement or « learning agreement » established in advance, guarantees the recognition of mobility in the student's curriculum, subject to passing the exams.

Special needs department

Any student with a disability, should mention it at the time of his/her application so that Sciences Po Aix can organise individualised responses according to the specific needs of the student (tailored study curriculum. setting up extra time for exams, provision of dedicated software, etc.). He/she will be received by the representative who will make an appointment with the preventive medicine department. CHECK-LIST

Important documents to take with you to France

- Valid passport or national identity card for the duration of your stay

 - Proof of social security coverage.
 - For European Students: European Health Insurance Card
 - Proof of address in France

Students with special needs will have to provide a medical certificate with certified translation

It is important:

- → To keep the name, address and phone number of the person who dealt with all the administrative procedures at the French embassy or consulate in your home country.
- → To have your documents translated into French and to have certified copies
- → In order to have a permanent access to these documents, scan and send them to yourself by e-mail.
- → To keep an identity document and your resident permit with you at all times.

Administrative procedures

Passports and visas

The conditions for entry of international students into France depend on the country of origin. Being in possession of a valid passport (or ID card) is essential for all international students. Some will also have to apply for a visa and obtain a residency permit for the duration of their mobility.

- Students from the European Economic Area (EEA)
 You do not need a visa to enter the Schengen area: you must possess a valid identity card or a valid passport.
- Students from outside the European Economic Area (EEA) You must present a passport still valid for 3 months after the end of your stay in France and, for any stay in France of more than three months, apply for a long-stay visa for studies (residency permit VLS-TS) in your country of residence two months before your departure.

On arrival for non-EEA students

Upon arrival in France, students must obtain a residency permit:

- If the passport contains a VLS / TS
 This visa is a residency permit. The visa must be validated by the French Office of Immigration and Integration (OFII) within 3 months of arrival.
- If the passport does not include a VLS / TS
 The student does not have a long-stay visa and must then report to the sub-prefecture of Aix-en-Provence to apply for a residency permit. This request must be made within two months of arrival in France.

Social security

It is compulsory in France to adhere to the Social Security system.

— Students from EU / EEA or Quebec EU / EEA students must bring a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) issued by the health services of their country, and those of Quebec, an SE401-O-106 form.

— Non-EU / EEA students: Register online for Social Security on the website: etudiantetranger.ameli.fr When registration is completed, the student receives an individual health card to present at any medical appointment in order to obtain a refund.

Civil liability insurance

In France, it is mandatory to be covered by a civil liability insurance; if the student is not covered by his/her private insurance, he/she can subscribe to it free of charge at the bank when opening an account.

Translation of documents

Throughout their stay in France, students will have to carry out administrative procedures (housing, health, transport, etc.) for which documents and supporting documents translated into French by a sworn translator will be requested. The deadlines for obtaining an officially certified translation vary according to the size and the number of documents, so this must be done in advance; note that it can take up to 2 months.

Welcome desk for international students

The welcome desk for international students is at Aix Marseille University, on the Schuman Campus, Hall du B.timent Porte, 29 avenue Robert Schuman in Aix-en-Provence. It is open from late August to mid-October (first university semester only) and allows international students to get help for their various administrative procedures: Residency permit, Health, Housing, Bank, Transport, Insurance, Culture and leisure, Sport, Studies in France, Scholarship, Alumni...

Accommodation in student halls (Gazelles, Cuques, Estelan, Meyran) is the least expensive solution: A renovated and furnished room of 10-12 sq m with private toilet and bathroom and shared kitchen costs around € 270 per month. Covers are provided. You will need sheets (bed size 90X190 cm), kitchen utensils, etc. All rooms have Internet access The shared premises are: TV room, work rooms, telephone booths.

Booking procedure:

Sciences Po Aix has a partnership with the CROUS which guarantees each year a number of places. You must apply to the International Relations Department by submitting the room reservation form before May 15 for an arrival in September or October 15 for an arrival in January.

— Private university residences A number of private residences offer rooms for students. Although they may be more comfortable, their cost is higher (between € 400 and € 700 per month). To reserve, a deposit and a letter of guarantee from a person residing in France are required.


Insurance

Financial support for housing

Housing benefit is granted by the Caisse d'Allocation Familiale (CAF). The application form can be downloaded from the CAF website: www.caf.fr There are two types of allowance: APL (Personalised Housing Assistance) and ALS (Social Housing Allowance). These allowances are not specifically for students. They therefore benefit students as much as any citizen.

Note: A TRANSLATED birth certificate is required for any CAF application.

Note: Your request must be made in the month following your arrival.



1 How to benefit from APL or ALS?

To benefit from APL, the student must be a tenant, sub-tenant or share housing in a new or old home. The lease must be in the name of the occupants.

Technical detail: the accommodation cannot be less than 9 sqm for one person and 16 sqm for a couple. It must also meet safety standards.

2 Amount of allowance

The amount is variable. The calculation scale is identical for APL and ALS. It takes into account the student's resources, the number of dependents, the place of residence, the amount of rent and the type of rental (flatsharing, furnished or unfurnished housing, etc.). For students housed in a university campus, the allowance is around \in 90 per month.

CAUTION! The period of application processing can be long (up to 5 weeks). Do not expect the first payment before this deadline.

3 Conditions of the allowance

Foreign students can apply for this allowance provided that they have completed the immigration formalities.

Plan your budget Cost of living

An international student must be able to justify sufficient resources during his/her stay to obtain the visa and residency permit (French bank statement, certificate of the amount and duration of any scholarship, etc.). The amount officially required by the French authorities is $\mathfrak E$ 615 monthly, but this sum is insufficient to cover all costs.

Example of a monthly budget for a university student:

Housing (student halls)	€ 270
Meals RU (Restaurant universitaire)	€ 200
Food shopping (breakfast, drinks)	€ 160
Books and supplies	€ 50
Public transport	€ 20
Personal care	€ 60
Leisure, going out, travelling	€ 65

For example:

Additional costs on arrival should be considered.

The first month's expenses will be nearly double those of the following months:

— Private accommodation

A deposit for your accommodation (from 1 to 2 months rent) + an advance of rent (1 to 2 months rent)

— Student halls

All rent for one semester

— Possible installation costs sheets, towels, kitchen utensils, etc.

Various subscriptions and memberships
 (sport, etc.)

Credit card

Make sure you can use your credit card in France. Cards commonly accepted in Europe are Visa, Mastercard and American Express for payments from \odot 10 to \odot 15 usually.

Good deals

Students receive discounts on numerous services upon presentation of their student card. Museums, cinemas, some restaurants, hairdressers and bookshops propose special offers or rates for students. Remember to find out about these good deals!

Bank account

When you arrive in France, it is advisable to open a bank account (usually free).

It is compulsory for nationals of non-European countries. The major French banks have branches in Aix city centre: Crédit Lyonnais, BNP Paribas, Société Générale, Crédit Agricole, etc., and are generally open from Monday to Friday from 9 am to 5 pm.

You can put funds on your bank account either fully upon arrival (with traveller's checks for example) or by transfer from bank to bank abroad. Learn about the exact procedures from your banker before you leave to avoidexcessive transfer fees. Every semester, The International Association of Sciences Po Aix helps international students who would like to open a bank account and accompany them to the bank.

Documents to provide to open a bank account: a copy of the passport, proof of address, student card, pre-enrolment or residency permit..

Working

Foreign students holding a VLS-TS residency permit and foreign students who are nationals of the European Economic Area may get a paid job in France without having to apply for a work permit.

— Under what conditions?
Salaried activity must remain ancillary to studies. Students are limited to a duration of 964 hours per year. The employer must make a nominative declaration of the foreign student to the prefecture that granted the student's residency permit.

Mobile Phone

There are four major networks in France: Free, SFR, Bouygues Télécom, Orange. However, other mobile operators also have interesting offers: Simyo, Virgin, Sosh, Red SFR...

The choice is very varied in terms of service, price and the duration of packages. There is often a charge for an international call service. Do some research before choosing your operator. To call abroad from France, dial: 00 + country code + number



Getting an appointment with a doctor

In France, everyone can choose their doctor. It costs € 25 for a GP consultation. Home visits, or at night, or on Sundays and holidays cost more. The request for reimbursement from the social security is made later (usually partial).
